MOIST HEAT PACK

NOVOHeat™

Instructions -

Moist heat pack is a simple and effective method for applying moist heat to localized area. It gives at least 30 minutes of therapeutic moist heat. Place it in a sealed plastic bag and store in freezer when not in use. When re-use, remove it from plastic bag and follow heating instructions.

- 1. Hold the pack by the corner loops and gently shake it. This contributes the filler and permits it to swell (absorb water) evenly.
- 2. Place pack in a heating unit large enough to accommodate it (for home, use a pot or pan).
- 3. Fill the heating unit with enough water to keep the pack completely immersed.
- 4. Let the pack soaks into water for around 16-20 hours, warm or hot water can have better effect. The pack will become completely swollen with water. This long soaking procedure is necessary only with a new pack. After this initial use, the pack can be prepared in accordance with the below instructions.

MICROWAVE - If microwaving, place the hot pack in a microwave safe container and cover completely with water. Place container in microwave and heat it at full power until water temperature reaches 71 degrees C (160 degrees F), microwave it for about 60 - 90 seconds.

STOVE- If using stove, put the heating unit on the stove and bring to a boil. Reduce the heat control to a low setting after the water boils. Temperature should not exceed 75 degrees C (167 degrees F).

The heated pack can be applied to the treatment with a bath towel or the customed designed terry cover.





Application -

- Carefully remove the heated pack from the heating unit.
- Place the heat pack on towel or terry cover and completely wrap the pack with the towel.
- The steam from the heated pack will penetrate the layers of toweling and reach the area being treated.
- To vary the heat intensity, increase or decrease the number of toweling layers. If the treatment area is too hot, add a layer or two of toweling. As the heat subsides, layers of toweling can be removed.



Warning & Precautions –

- Treatment time should not exceed 30 minutes.
- Monitor Moist Heat Pack application to ensure that the skin is not becoming too hot.
- Damage to the skin can occur from exposure to the extreme heat or cold. The water temperature in the Heating Unit is approximately 71 degrees C (160 degrees F). Follow the above instructions when use, otherwise the Heating Packs have potential to burst and leak that will cause burns, scaring and injury.
- Do not sit or lie on the Heat Pack.
- Never allow them to dry after use.
- Do not retrieve Heat Packs from tank or replace them in tank with unprotected hand.
